County Related Development and Transportation Bills

Development

H.B. 14 by Harris – Requires third party review of plat applications by developer engineer after 45 days. Effective 9/1/23

H.B. 2127 by Burrows – Waives county immunity and allows lawsuits to be filed in any county for enforcing an invalid order or rule in fields “occupied” by the state in Agriculture Code, Business and Commerce Code, Finance Code, Insurance Code, Labor Code, Local Government Code, Natural Resources Code, Occupations Code, or Property Code. Effective 9/1/23

H.B. 2965 by Vasut – Prohibits applicable state law from being waived for civil works project. Effective 9/1/23

H.B. 3697 by Rep. Terry Wilson/ Sen. Bettencourt – Changes the plat requirement and may weaken the ability to prevent “flag-lot” developments. Effective 9/1/23

H.B. 4082 by Goldman - Limits use of COs and tax anticipation notes. Effective 9/1/23

Transportation

H.B. 586 by Thompson and Bettencourt – Relating to municipal annexation of certain rights-of-way.

H.B. 898 by Stucky and Parker – Relating to the offense of passing certain vehicles on a highway.

H.B. 3297 by Harris and Middleton – Relating to the elimination of regular mandatory vehicle safety inspections for noncommercial vehicles and the imposition of replacement fees.

H.B. 3646 by Guillen – Relating to certain regulations regarding commercial driver’s licenses.

S.B. 323 by Huffman and Kitzman – Relating to the enforcement of commercial motor vehicle safety standards in certain counties.

S.B. 1023 by Nichols and Canales – Relating to the establishment and posting of the maximum loads permitted on certain bridges.
