GENERAL SUMMARY

Under direct supervision, the purpose of the position is to perform a variety of general road maintenance duties.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Perform maintenance of roads and bridges including flagging and directing traffic through construction and maintenance zones; cutting brush, grass, and other vegetation; patching and sealing pavement.

Mixes concrete and mortar and shovels backfill to repair and maintain roads and bridges.

Repairs catch basins and completes other drainage work.

Operates select equipment for construction and maintenance projects including air compressor, basic skid steer with grapple bucket, forks, and broom, two yard rubber tired loader, brush chipper, single axle water truck and dump truck, air drill and jack hammer, mowers including rear brush hog, push and side mount rotary, pickup truck, rollers, six ton trailers, and chain saw weed eater, power and tow broom, quickie saw, plate compactor and jumping jack, basic backhoe, pressure washers, striping equipment, fence building equipment and bucket truck.

Cleans culverts as needed.

Assists Emergency Management with emergencies and natural disasters
