# Around the State, Project Spotlight- Birch Road Bridge Replacement

The City of Clear Lake Shores is a coastal community in northern Galveston County with a population of approximately 1,200 people. There are two roadways that access the city and both roadways have load rated bridges. Access to the city by fire trucks, garbage trucks and other heavier loads is impaired without improvements to these bridges.

The Birch Road Bridge is along one of these two routes into the city. It is located just outside the city limits in the unincorporated county. The bridge was load rated to 38,000 pounds gross and 28,000 pounds for tandem axle. A project to replace the Birch Road Bridge was selected as part of the 2017 Galveston County Road and Bridge Bond program.

The channel below the bridge is used for recreational boating. Coordination with the homeowner's association and a nearby elementary school during design and construction was critical. The new single-span design replaces the 2-span bridge and the existing center supports will be removed. A sidewalk was also added to the new bridge. Because of the recreational boating, elevation of the low chord of the bridge was also a concern.

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Nationwide Permit 14 was used for compliance with the Clean Water Act.

Existing water and sanitary sewer force mains attached to the bridge were relocated by the utility district to a new utility bridge prior to the demolition of the vehicular bridge.

Prior to construction Galveston County entered an agreement with TxDOT so that funds expended for this project could be credited as "equivalent-match" towards another deficient bridge in the county.

Construction started in July 2020 and is scheduled for completion in March 2021. Total project costs are \$1,330,000. At the completion of the project, the City of Clear Lake Shores will annex the road and bridge right-of-way and will have a safer access to and from their city.
